you too.

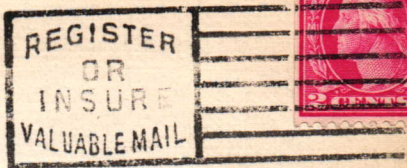
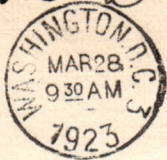
